SPECIFICATIONS:

1. Scope of Services:

Florida Polytechnic University Board of Trustees ("University") is seeking proposals from financially sound, qualified IT consulting service firms to provide management and consulting services related to planning and managing the migration from the University's current CAMS student information system to the Ellucian Banner SaaS system.

Contractor will report to the University's Chief Information Officer (CIO) as the manager of this Contract. Successful Respondent will advise and support the Information Technology Services (ITS) and Banner Project leadership teams in creating and managing a successful process for migrating to the new Banner ERP environment.

2. Informational Background:

Prior to 2015, Florida Poly implemented and began using Thesis CAMS as its student information system (SIS). In September of 2023, Florida Poly contracted with Ellucian Banner through a competitive solicitation process to provide software and implementation services for a new University-wide student information system ("SIS") to replace the University's current SIS platform, which is Thesis CAMS.

3. Method of Award:

The recommendation for award will be submitted by Chief Information Officer (CIO) to the University Procurement Official overseeing this solicitation. The award will be based on the following evaluation criteria:

Offeror Qualifications
Program Plan – Services Defined
References and Past Experience
Financial Proposal
Optional Services

4. Contract Period:

The Contract resulting from this RFP and the Successful Respondent's Proposal shall be in the form of a Professional Service Contract (PSC) and will have an initial period of one (year) with an option to renew for two additional one (1) year periods. Annual renewal will be contingent upon the University's needs and satisfaction with the services performed and the overall performance of the Contractor.

The University reserves the right to renegotiate any term and/or condition as may be necessary to meet requirements for any renewal period. The Successful Respondent will be advised of any proposed revisions prior to the renewal period.

5. References and Past Experience:

Respondent shall supply the names, addresses, telephone numbers and complete contact information of at least three (3) references for which work has been accomplished within the last five (5) years. Include a complete description of the types of services provided. References should be relevant with regard to the scope of services outlined in this RFP. By submitting a Proposal, the Respondent grants permission to the University to contact references.

6. Proposal Submission and Deadline

Offeror must provide one (1) electronic copy to procurement@floridapoly.edu. The Proposal and copies must be prior to 2:00 PM(ET); April 9, 2024.

Note: Proposals received after the closing date and time will not be considered.

Note: There will be no public opening of Proposals. All Proposals will be kept confidential until such time that a contract is awarded. After a contract is awarded, all Proposals will become public record, as described.

7. Insurance

To the extent that Contractor mee's the demittion of "contractor" under section 119.0701, Florida Statutes, in addition to other contract requirement provided by law, Contractor must comply with public records laws, including the following provision. If action 1 9.0701, requiring Contractor to:

- 1. Keep and maintain public scords required by University to perform the service.
- 2. Upon request from the University's custodian of public records, provide the University with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law.
- 3. Ensure that confidential information or records that are exempt from public records disclosure are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of this agreement, renewals, and following completion of the contract if Contractor does not transfer the records to University.
- 4. Upon completion of this Agreement, transfer, at no cost, to University all public records in possession of Contractor or keep and maintain public records required by University to perform the service.
 - If Contractor transfers all public records to University upon completion of the contract, Contractor must destroy any duplicate confidential information or records that are exempt from public records disclosure.
 - 2) If Contractor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of this Agreement, Contractor must meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records.



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- 3) All records stored electronically must be provided to University, upon request from the University's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the University.
- 5. Third parties requesting to inspect or copy public records relating to this agreement must be made directly to University. If University does not possess the requested records, University will notify Contractor of the request, and Contractor must provide the records to the public agency or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time.
- 6. The University may inspect the:
 - 1) Financial records, papers, and documents of the Control to that are directly related to the performance of the contract or the expenditure of state ands.
 - 2) Contractor's programmatic records, papers, and docume which he University determines are necessary to monitor the performance of this agreement are being met.

- 7. The terms of section 6 are material tensor agreement, and failure to comply may result in termination and/or civil penalties.

8. Indemnification.

- 1. Contractor agrees to releasing mnify, defend, and hold harmless: (1) Florida Polytechnic University or The University Board or Trustees (2) The Florida Board of Governors; (3) The State of Florida and their respective trustees, officers, emp., Les and agents from:
 - a) any and all liability, fines, royalties, fees, taxes, suits, claims, demands and actions, costs, attorney's fees and expenses of any kind or nature whatsoever ("Losses") for any loss of life, personal, bodily or economic injury or damage or loss to property arising out of the negligent or intentional acts, errors or omissions of Contractor, its officers, agents, employees and contractors; and from and against any orders, judgments or decrees which may be entered pursuant thereto.
- 2. Nothing in this agreement may be construed as an indemnification of the Contractor by the University or as a waiver of sovereign immunity beyond that provided in section 768.28, Florida Statutes.
- 3. This provision will survive the termination of this agreement.
- 4. Due to its sovereign immunity, University will not indemnify Contractor.
- 9. Copyright and Intellectual Property.



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- 1. If Contractor uses copyrighted materials or documents not owned by University ("Copyrighted Materials") in Contractor's performance of the agreement, Contractor represents and warrants that it owns, or is licensed to use and to authorize others to use, the Copyrighted Materials.
- 2. Contractor will, at its expense, defend any suit brought against University and will indemnify University against an award of damages and costs, including attorney's fees, made against University by a settlement or final judgment that is based on a claim that University's use of the Copyrighted Materials infringes a trademark or copyright of a third party.
- 3. This provision will survive the termination of this agreement.
- 4. Any reports or deliverables provided to the University pursuant to this agreement are considered as works for hire, and the University may use such reports or deliverables for any purpules.

10. Termination.

- 1. Termination at Will. This Agreement may be terminated. University by viding written notice to Contractor of such intent to terminate at least 10 days prior to reflect the date of such termination.
- 2. Termination for Cause. Notwithstanding the projectors of subsect on 11(A) above, University may, upon 5 days' written notice to Contractor set forth with recific the basis for the termination, terminate this Agreement for Cause. For purposes of this Agreement, "conse" is defined as Contractor failure to perform the Services within the time specified herein or have tension the eof or Contractor failure to adhere to any of the material terms of this Agreement.
- 3. If this Agreement is termin, 'ed, coversity will only be liable for payment of goods received and services rendered prior to the of tomination and accepted by University.
- 11. Availability of Funds. he State Florit a's and University's performance and obligation to pay under this agreement is contingent upon sufficient appropriation by the Florida Legislature and other entities' allowance of the University to use such funds If the entities controlling such funding fail to appropriate funds or to allow University to use funds and University has determined, in University's sole discretion, that there are insufficient funds available to cover University's obligation under this Agreement, University has the right to terminate this Agreement for the upcoming year without damage, penalty, cost, or further obligation. University will notify Contractor at least 30 days in advance of a termination pursuant to this provision; University must pay for all services rendered until the date of termination.
- **12. Insurance.** During the term of this contract, Contractor must maintain in full force at its own expense amounts of insurance that at a minimum cover the Contractor (or subcontractors') exposure in performing this Agreement. University is self-insured and will provide its Certificate of Insurance upon request; University is not required to obtain additional insurance for this Agreement.
- **13. Force Majeure.** Neither party will be deemed to be in default of its obligations if and so long as it is prevented from performing its obligations by an act of war, terrorism, labor strike, nuclear explosion, earthquake, hurricane, tornado, or other catastrophic natural event or act of God.



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- 14. Compliance with Law. Contractor will comply with all statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, orders, and licensing requirements that are applicable to the conduct of its business, including those of federal, state, and local agencies having jurisdiction and/or authority over it. If this agreement is funded in any part with federal funds, the terms of section 202 of Executive Order 11246, as amended, are incorporated as if fully set forth in this agreement. The hyperlink in this agreement is for convenience only and any failure of it to function does not relieve the Contractor of any obligations of this clause.
- **15. Contractor.** Contractor is retained by University only for those purposes and to the extent set forth in this Agreement, and Contractor relation to University will, during the term of this Agreement, be that of independent Contractor. Contractor is not and will not be considered as having an employee status. Contractor is responsible for the payment of any taxes on any monies received by Contractor.
- **16. Prohibitions.** Unless expressly and specifically authorized in writing by Unitary in advance, Contractor is prohibited from engaging in any of the following:
 - 1. Incurring any debt or obligation on behalf of University
 - 2. Entering into any contract, arrangement, or transaction hich by a University to any extent or creates any obligation on University; and/or
 - 3. Utilizing University's name, credit, reputation, 70. I will, sources, and/or assets for any purpose.
- **17.** Travel. Not applicable.
- **18. Notices.** Any notice to either party must be in writing and signed by the party giving it, and served:
 - 1. By hand notice; or
 - 2. Through the United States Mail, c cage prepaid, registered or certified, return receipt requested; or
 - 3. Through expedited mail or package service, if a receipt showing the delivery has been retained; or

- 19. Assignment. This agreement may not be assigned by Contractor without the express written consent of University.
- **20. Governing Law.** This agreement and any amendments to it are governed by the laws of the State of Florida and venue for any actions arising out of this agreement must be in the state courts in Polk County, Florida.
- **21. Software.** If Contractor is providing software, University may create and retain a copy of the software and related documentation for backup and disaster-recovery purposes, and for archival purposes for use after this agreement is terminated.
- **22. Survival.** Any provision of this agreement providing for performance by either party after termination of this agreement survives termination and continues to be effective and enforceable.
- 23. E-Verify. All terms defined in section 448.095, Florida Statutes are ad pted ar "incorporated into this provision. Pursuant to section 448.095, Florida Statutes, Contractor certifies that it is regist red with and uses the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employmental providity of all new employees hired by the Contractor during the term of this agreement. If Contract renters it to a contract with a subcontractor to perform work or provide services pursuant to this agreement Contractor must also require the subcontractor to comply with the requirements of section 448.095. Florida Statutes. The subcontractor must provide to Contractor an affidavit stating that the subcontractor does not a new year, or ract with, or subcontract with or to any unauthorized alien. Contractor must maintain a copy with afficient in the duration of the contract. University may terminate this agreement immediately upon notice to untract. For any violation of this provision.
- 24. Confidentiality of Information. In Consister is exposed to University's confidential information (such as donor information), Contractor will keep such information confidential and will act in accordance with any guidelines and applicable laws including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the Gramm-Leach Bliley Act.
- 25. Conflicts of Interest. Acceptance of his Agreement certifies that Contractor is aware of the requirements of Chapter 112, Florida Statutes and in pranance with the requirements of Chapter 112, Florida Statutes and other laws and regulations concerning conflicts of interests in dealing with entities of the State of Florida. Contractor certifies that its directors and/or principal officers are not employed and/or affiliated with the University unless a current Conflict of Interest (Report of Outside Activity/Employment) form has been completed, executed by such director or officer and approved in accordance with applicable University policies or rules. Violation of this section by Contractor is a ground for cancellation of this Agreement.
- 26. Civil Rights. The Contractor and any subcontractors must abide by the requirements of 41 CFR §§ 60-1.4(a), 60-300.5(a) and 60-741.5(a) prohibiting discrimination against qualified individuals based on their status as protected veterans or individuals with disabilities and prohibit discrimination against all individuals based on their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender, identity, or national origin. Moreover, these regulations require that covered prime contractors and subcontractors take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment individuals without regard to race, color, religion, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, protected veteran status or disability.
